Reporting Fiscal Year 2021 | 2nd Quarter | October-December 2020

RELIEF FOR THE HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY

Nationwide, the pandemic has wreaked havoc on the hospitality industry. Locally, the story is the same, with restaurants closed to indoor dining due to mitigation efforts, attractions seeing fewer visitors, retail experiencing declining sales, venues shuttered, and hotels experiencing historic lows in occupancy.

With such significant challenges facing the industry, the 3,270 jobs supported by travel and tourism in the greater Champaign County area are in jeopardy, with many of them lost.

In April 2020, the VCC Foundation reallocated event expenses for the canceled 2020 Toast to Tourism celebration to create a Hospitality Relief Fund to provide direct financial support for former hotel employees in the greater Champaign County area as housekeepers, caterers, cooks, front desk staff or anywhere in our hotel partner operations.

Over \$12,000 was initially raised thanks to matching funds from the Champaign-Urbana Hotel Lodging Association (CUHLA) to provide financial assistance to 42 displaced employees at each of our current hotel partners.

In November 2020, the Hospitality Relief Fund was relaunched and expanded in response to strict mitigation efforts that continued to severely impact the hospitality industry. Nominations were sought from business owners or general managers within food & beverage, lodging, event venues, and attractions for employees facing financial difficulties due to loss of job or significantly reduced hours.

Funding has been provided through private businesses or individual donations to the Visit Champaign County Foundation lead by efforts from the VCCF and VCC Board members themselves. Significant donations were received from the United Way of Champaign County and the Champaign County Chamber of Commerce Foundation. Additionally, over 100 individuals have shown their generosity and support with donations to the fund to further the impact.

Since April 2020, the Hospitality Relief Fund has raised \$33,365, and been distributed to 136 hospitality heroes across 53 businesses. Jobs ranged from baristas, servers, cooks, maintenance, housekeeping, and more.

While the fund can't solve the challenges of the pandemic, the VCC Foundation is proud to offer our Hospitality Relief Fund to provide some assistance to our community's hospitality heroes that have shown tremendous resolve.

The fund will remain open to nominations as long as donations continue. Individuals and organizations looking to donate can do so on the <u>Hospitality Relief Fund site</u>, where business owners and general managers can also submit nominations.



Stakeholder engagement has never been more critical during a time of significant change in our organizational mission, as we continue to meet community needs and focus on economic recovery in the near future.

We work with the best Board of Directors and Foundation Board of Directors and enjoyed our virtual holiday joint board meeting celebration on December 2, complete with provided desserts from Hopscotch Bakery, Suzu's Bakery, and Tasty Tart that were picked up by each board member prior to the Zoom meeting. Thank you to VCC Board Chair, Laura Bleill, and VCC Foundation Board Chair, Dennis Robertson, for guiding our direction.

As part of our advocacy efforts, one of my favorite activities is giving an annual presentation to our public strategic partners. Presentations were made to Champaign County Board (September 15,) Urbana City Council (September 21, October 5, October 12,) Rantoul Village Board (October 6,) Mahomet Village Board (October 20,) Savoy Village Board



(October 21,) St. Joseph Village Board (November 10,) and Champaign City Council (November 17.)

I also participated in the virtual Destinations International Advocacy Summit on October 15 and November 12. Our goal was to engage with

industry experts and each other about our changing industry at a crossroads. Great discussion about the opportunities ahead!!

Statewide, the IL Council of CVB's (ICCVB) hosted a hybrid fall conference in the Quad Cities on October 5-6, which showed the value of business travel when done safely and the importance of human connection for education and engagement.

Grateful for our board leadership, our partners and our work force who support a community-based mission to promote a welcoming destination experience for visitors to strengthen economic opportunity and enhance the lives of residents. Everything starts from that point.

Meetings & Conferences Update

The meetings and events industry continues to be impacted harshly during the pandemic with group gatherings still banned in Illinois and much of the country. Despite that, there is much hope for the future as VCC and its partners look at the long-term possibilities for solid recovery in 2022 and beyond. In a study conducted by PlanSponsor and NewsDash on December 7, 2020, more than one-third of responders said they did not feel it would be safe to attend in-person conferences again until sometime in 2022. September 2021 was selected by 12.2% of respondents as being safe to attend in-person conferences again, assuming safety precautions are taken. March, April and May were each selected by 4.9% of readers. And nearly one-in-10 each (9.8%) selected June, July, August and October. The majority of respondents who chose to leave comments about attending in-person conferences in 2021 said it will depend on the effectiveness of vaccines and vaccine distribution. With the general public on deck to start receiving vaccines mid-2021, there is great optimism for moving forward. VCC continues to keep a pulse on our partners, planners, and community's comfort level and readiness

to welcome groups back to our area.



Meet, Stay & Play Videos

Caitlyn and Terri worked together to provide our Event Venues and Hotel Partners with COVID-related, propertyspecific videos. The goal of each video was to showcase how they are responding to the pandemic and implementing new safety

measures and guidelines to keep employees, guests, and attendees safe while visiting their properties. This was provided free of cost to any of our partners who wished to utilize this service. Five videos have been shared across multiple platforms from YouTube, Facebook and LinkedIn, to email and hotel specific websites, featuring the Hyatt Place, Hilton Garden Inn,

Venue CU Tour

Visit Champaign County continued to play a continual role in distributing pertinent information to businesses and residents during the pandemic. ChampaignCountySafe.org is continually updated to inform the public of timely information through a new blog section added in October, including details on testing, vaccinations, and important information regarding mitigation efforts.

SALES & MARKETING EFFORTS



Sports & Events Overview

Although events have largely been halted due to the pandemic, VCC is actively pursuing and bidding on future business. Highlights of those efforts over the last quarter include:

The Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA) Fly-in

2022—VCC and Willard previously submitted a bid in 2018. Begun in 2014, the AOPA Fly-ins bring aviators from hundreds of miles to enjoy a weekend exploring the airport and surrounding community. The two-day event typically draws between 3,000 and 7,000 people and more than 500 aircraft.

Air Race E—Along with the Village of Rantoul and the Rantoul National Aviation Center (RNAC), VCC submitted a bid to host and Air Race E World Cup race in 2023 and beyond. The three-day international event would bring an estimated 40,000 spectators. The Formula One race would be powered by electric aircraft with speeds topping at more than 250 MPH around an oval-shaped air circuit.

With VCC's support, the **Rantoul Family Sports Complex** has secured two new events. T2 Sporting will give the area its third major youth soccer event, hosting a tournament during the second week of June. United States Youth Soccer plans to host two tournaments each year, which will fill 1,800 room nights each, beginning in the fall of 2021.

IHSA Hotel Visit—On November 12, Kurt Gibson from the IHSA joined Mike on a tour of the five hotels which will host IHSA Boys Basketball teams (Holiday Inn, Home2 Suites, Comfort Suites, Hampton Inn Urbana, and the Hyatt Place) starting in 2022 as well as the I Hotel which will house officials and staff.

Disc Golf—VCC is helping to facilitate the construction of a temporary 18-hole disc golf course at Allerton Park. The goal is to turn the course into a permanent course and attract the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) 2022 Women's International Championship to Allerton and two other area courses.

You're Out Visit—The Chicago filmmakers interested in shooting a baseball movie titled, "You're Out" toured several potential sites in the Champaign County area in October. The film is currently slated for production in June or July of 2021.






Criss-Cross Challenge

The Illinois Marathon's Criss-Cross Virtual Challenge celebrates the state of Illinois. This 25-week virtual event takes participants across the entirety of the state and encourages runners and walkers to learn about the towns, villages, and cities through which they pass on a North-South and East-West route. To help collect information about the 659-mile journey, Taylor assisted event organizers in researching the various destinations featured. With assistance from travel partners all across the state, over 100 stops on the Criss-Cross Virtual Challenge routes are featured with fun facts, historical information, and profiles to help participants learn more about the state.

Shop Local Guide

In an unprecedented year of challenges for local retailers, Visit Champaign County's annual Shop Local Guide was more critical than ever. Released the week before Thanksgiving, the guide highlights local retailers, restaurants, and more to encourage holiday shoppers to spend their money at small



businesses as opposed to big-box chains stores. Taylor cultivates the list each year, and 2020's Shop Local guide was the largest profile of local shops yet. Follow-up posts focused on specific types of gifts helped provide additional marketing and exposure to local businesses all throughout the months of November and December. With momentum surrounding local support thanks to our community, the Shop Local Guide and accompanying blogs performed well on the VCC website and social media.
